What do you really want from your career?

We don't always ask ourselves this important question, but it's vital if we are to assess what success means to us and whether our career is serving us in the ways we actually want.

In other words: is your career fit for purpose?

Implicit in this question is the relationship between living and working, and how you view this equation. You may have heard the proposition, 'Do you live to work or work to live?' I wonder where you stand on that one - and if you agree with this oppositional perspective.

It's probable that this equation will change with each new stage in your working life, so it's important to re-visit your career success criteria regularly.

Coaching Tip 1:

This exercise is about YOU and what you value in your working life. Keep a wary eye out for any "shoulds" – feelings that you *ought* to have certain criteria such as 'progression' or 'status'. It is vital that in identifying your own personal success criteria, you learn to notice when you are responding to your own values, the values of others, or of society at large. Learn to listen to your deeper wisdom, which combines emotional intelligence, intellect, and intuition.

Coaching Tip 2:

Think of your personal life and the work you do as being parts of one whole: your life. Clarity around the ideal life you are seeking and how work supports and contributes to that vision will empower you to make changes for a more fulfilling life.

Possible Career Success Criteria: Is your career fit for purpose?

Step 1: Working quickly and without over-thinking, highlight which criteria are most important to you in the table below. Limit this to 15.

Step 2: Again, let your intuition guide you and from your top 15, select the 5 criteria that are most important to you.

Step 3: Rank these 5 criteria in order of priority.

Step 4: How does your current working life score out of 5 for each criterion? Add your scores together to reach a total out of 25.
